2. A note of caution when considering the interpretation you may put on your meta-analyses


Pereira and colleagues looked at 80 Cochrane reviews where 4 or more studies had been combined in the 2005 publication, and found that the effect size was smaller in the 2010 update. ('Statistically significant meta-analyses of clinical trials have modest credibility and inflated effects'. Pereira TV, loannidis JPA. Journal of Clinical Epidemiology 2011; 64: 1060–9.) Peter Herbison gives a commentary in the Cochrane Methods journal where he makes the point that if meta-analyses with 4 or more included studies are subject to



change in a subsequent update of a Cochrane review, then we should be very cautious how we interpret reviews where even fewer studies are combined.
